ANALYSIS OF HOT OCCUPATIONS IN JAMAICA

- APRIL 1 TO JUNE 30, 2014

Hot Occupations are leading job vacancies in the Jamaican labour market. Advertisements in the *Gleaner* and *Observer* newspapers as well as online job placement websites were reviewed to highlight the Hot Occupations. These job vacancies were also analysed by parish and regions.

The number of job vacancies published in the print media for the period April 1 to June 30, 2014 was 4,435, (See Table 1). The review showed that the most frequently advertised position was Sales Representative (See Table 2).

Advertised Vacancies by Occupational Group

Table 1 indicates that the majority of the vacancies advertised belonged to the following occupational groups:

- 1. "Professionals, Senior Officials and Technicians" with 1,912;
- 2. "Service Workers, Shop and Market Sales Workers" with 1,234;
- 3. "Elementary Occupations" with 436.

Hottest Vacancies: April 1 to June 30, 2014

- 3. **Elementary Occupations** have consistently demanded persons in Sales, Household Services and Casual Work, that is:
- Domestic helpers and Day Care Attendants (See Table 2)

Top Ten Jobs Advertised: April 1 to June 30, 2014

The April 1 to June 30, 2014 and January 1 to March 31, 2014 quarters were similar as Sales Representatives and Security Officers/Guards accounted for the highest number of vacancies (See Table 2). Other notable vacancies were Customer Care Associates, Chefs/Cooks, Drivers, Bartenders, Domestic Helpers, Cashiers, Receptionists and Child Care Workers.

Vacancies by Industry

During April 1 to June 30, 2014 approximately 59.1 percent of the total vacancies were linked to the "Other Community, Social and Personal Services", "Wholesale & Retail, Repair of Motor Vehicles, Motorcycles and Personal and Household Goods", "Hotels and Restaurants", "Real Estate, Renting and Business Services" and "Manufacture" industries. Table 4 lists the top ten vacancies that were found in each of the five industries.

Work Permit Approvals

A work permit is mainly approved on the premise that local workers in specific occupations are in short supply. Vacancies Advertised via The Internet

The three electronic job-matching websites which were reviewed during the period April 1 to June 30, 2014 were SplashJamaica.com, Electronic Labour Exchange (ww.lmis.gov.jm) and CaribbeanJobs.com. Table 5 shows the top

ten most frequently advertised occupational areas and the related positions. A large number of the vacancies advertised via the internet belonged to the occupational group "Professionals, Senior Officials and Technicians" and over 400 jobs were posted on these websites during the quarter.
