AN ANALYSIS OF HOT OCCUPATIONS IN JAMAICA FOR

OCTOBER 4 TO DECEMBER 27, 2015

This document provides quarterly analysis of job advertisements published in the Careers Section of the Jamaica Gleaner and Observer newspapers between October 4 and December 27, 2015. It also provides analysis on Work Permits approved by Ministry of Labour and Social Security (MLSS) and Jobs advertised and solicited through the Electronic Labour Exchange (ELE) department within the MLSS.

Top 10 Occupations Advertised

The total number of jobs analyzed in the Gleaner and Observer for the period was 1,844. The Top 10 Occupations advertised was taken from the Career Section of the Gleaner and the Classifieds section of the Jamaica Observer. Managerial positions were the highest among the advertised jobs with 265; Officer positions were next with 213 (See Tables 1 and 1A).

Advertisement by Occupational Group

The jobs advertised were further classified by occupational groups¹. For the period under review, "Professionals" group was the highest with 744 or 40.3 per cent; while the second highest group was "Managers" (349 or 19.9 per cent) vacancies **(See Table 2).**

Advertisements by Industry

For the quarter, **"Real Estate, Renting and Business Activities"** was the largest industry (521 or 28.3 per cent), **"Education"** was next with 335 or 18.2 per cent. The other leading industry was **"Public Administration and Defence, Compulsory Social Security"** (272 or 14.8 per cent) **(See Table 4)**.

A summary of the Top Five Industries was completed to include the Top Five occupations advertised, the number and percentage for each industry. For the **"Real Estate, Renting and Business Activities"** industry, Manager Positions lead the top occupations, followed by Customer, Sales and Technical Representatives. The second industry on the list was **"Education"**, within this industry, Teacher positions came out on Top **(See Table 5)**.

REQUIRED CERTIFICATION AND QUALIFICATION FOR JOB ADVERTISEMENTS

Of the vacancies analyzed, 89 per cent stated a required qualification or certification. Of the vacancies published, 38 per cent requested a Bachelors Degree. Accounting certification followed with 13 per cent. These include CAT, ACCA, or Accounting Degree. Next was Masters Degrees with 8 per cent.

JOB ADVERTISEMENTS BY PARISH

Kingston and St. Andrew (KSA) recorded the highest number of job vacancies totalling 1,190 or 63 per cent. St. James followed with 269 or 14.2 per cent **(See Table 6)**.

An analysis was further conducted for the top parish (KSA); this revealed that Managers was the leading position advertised with 182 or 15.3 per cent. Officer positions (Accounting, Administrative, Business Development, Financial, Education, HR, Marketing, Medical, Programme and Security) followed with 145 or 12.2 per cent **(See Table 7)**.

For the parishes of St. Catherine and Westmoreland there were a total of 116 advertisements or 6.1 per cent of the vacancies. Teacher positions were mostly advertised in St. Catherine, while Sales Representatives was for Westmoreland.

Sixty six percent of the jobs advertised in St. Elizabeth for the period were for Teachers. Other positions included Sales Representatives and Manager positions. The top position advertised in Clarendon was Teacher **(See Table 11)**.

• Manchester, Trelawny, Portland, St. Thomas, St. Mary and Hanover

There was not an extensive range of vacancies listed. However, Principals and Teachers position were common among all the above-mentioned Parishes. Other vacancies included Porters, Senior Clerks, Regional Coordinators, Line servers and Sales Representatives.

Jobs Advertised by the Electronic Labour Exchange (ELE) Unit

An examination of the jobs available for the period revealed that there were 120 vacant positions. "Clerical Support Workers" and "Technicians and Associate Professionals" were the top occupational groups. Accounting Clerk positions were mainly available.

Accounting certification which includes Bachelors, Diploma and Certificate; Diploma in Business Administration and passes with a minimum of three (CSECs) Caribbean Secondary Examination Council were generally the required qualifications. Kingston and Manchester was the top recruiting Parishes.

Jobs advertised in other countries

In relation to jobs outside of Jamaica, fourteen (14) were advertised for Guyana, eleven (11) for Barbados, 7 for United States of America (USA), 4 for Grand Cayman, 2 for Canada and 1 for Turks and Caicos Island.

Managers, Senior Project Officers and Communication Specialists were among the jobs advertised for Guyana. For the USA, jobs advertised included, Office Cleaners, Handymen, Hotel Workers, Babysitters, Helpers, Practical Nurses and Teachers.

Work Permits Approved by Top Ten Vacant Positions

A review of work permits approved by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security during the period October 4 to December 27, 2015 showed there were a number of positions available locally which were filled by work permit applicants. A work permit is mainly approved on the premise that local workers in specific occupations are in short supply. The total number of work permits issued was 1,148.

Approximately 13.8 per cent of the work permits were among the occupational group, "Managers". The Top Ten list is as follows:
