1.0 Introduction

The Hot Occupation Analysis Report reviews job vacancies and work permit statistics extracted from administrative data produced by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security. It also analyses job advertisements obtained from major newspapers in Jamaica. The purpose of the Report is to determine the dominant occupations and skills required in the labour market during each quarter.

The Information is extracted from four (4) sources:

- 1. The Career section of the Gleaner and the Jamaica Observer newspaper, which advertise job openings by occupation, industry, parish and qualification;
- The job placement arm of the Labour Market Information System (LMIS), known as the Electronic Labour Exchange (ELE), that is administered by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security (MLSS);
- The Work Permit Department of the MLSS which grants work permits based on the requirements of the Foreign Nationals and Commonwealth Citizens (Employment) Act.
- Private Employment Agencies (PEAs) which are monitored by the MLSS in order to ensure compliance with the Employment Agencies Regulation Act (1957).²

This edition of the Report examines vacancies which were available during the January 1 to March 31, 2020 quarter, as well as the work permits granted for the period. It is important to note however, the vacancies reported are for formal establishments and does not take into account the informal economy in Jamaica.

2.0 Analysis of Hot Occupations in the Jamaican labour market

During the January to March 2020 quarter 1,730 jobs were advertised in the newspapers. These jobs were found in all occupational groups but were highest in the field of white collar jobs. Further analysis of these jobs were done by the occupational group, industrial group and parish to which the job is located in.

2.1 Hot Occupations in the Jamaican labour market from the newspapers

The Top Ten Jobs Advertised in the Gleaner and Observer Career Sections were as follows:-

A comparison of the first quarter of 2019 and 2020 revealed that Managers/ Directors/ Supervisors and Teachers/Lecturers were number 1 and number 2 respectively (see Table 1).

Further examination of the job vacancies revealed that some job titles were in higher demand more than some. For Managers the job vacancies that were in higher demand were: Operations, Sales, Project, Restaurant, Programme, Senior, Office, Branch, Brand, Procurement, Inventory and Regional Managers. For Directors the higher demand was Public Procurement, Human Resources and Human Resource Management (HRM) Directors. For Supervisor the higher demand was in the areas of Warehouse, Restaurant, Production and Sales Supervisor.

Teachers as a group exhibited a higher demand for certain fields in the subject areas Mathematics, English Language, English Language and Literature, Literacy Specialist, Social Studies, Spanish, History, Health and Family Life Education, Special Education and Visual Arts. Lecturers in demand were primarily in the field of the Health Sciences (specifically Anaesthesia and Intensive Care, Anatomical Pathology, Anatomy, Clinical Psychology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Pharmacology/ Toxicology, Physical Therapy, Nursing and Mycology/ phytopathology). Further analysis showed a relatively higher demand for Officers such as Accounting Officers, Human Resources, Project, Marketing, Procurement, Security, Technical and Business Development Officers. In the Technicians' group the most outstanding titles were Maintenance, Laboratory, Science Laboratory, Auto Body Repair/ Paint Technicians. In addition there were some vacancies for Accounting Technicians.

Specialization in Systems and Database Administrator were highest in the Administrator group. Business Analysts, Programme Analysts, Systems Analyst, Information Systems Analyst and Quality Assurance Analyst dominated the need for analysts. In the field of Secretaries attention should be paid to Executive Secretary, Legal Secretary and Senior Secretary for the quarter.

The field of Consultant was an area where demand was significant for Sales Consultants. Coordinator was an area where demand for workers such as Events, Marketing and Project Coordinators. Vacancy for Nurses were primarily for Registered Nurse and School Nurse.

2.2 Hot Occupations by Occupational Group

The major occupational groups were defined by the Statistical Institute of Jamaica (STATIN). Table 3 showed the nine major occupational groups and the total number of jobs advertised in each group. The results showed that vacancies were highest for Professionals (723) followed by Managers (322). This represented 41.8 and 18.6 per cent of the total jobs advertised respectively.

2.3 Hot Occupations by Industry Group

The data gathered was analysed by industry groups. These industry groups were derived from The Statistical Institute of Jamaica (STATIN) industrial classification. Table 5 showed the total jobs advertised by industry. The leading industry group was Education. This was largely due to the high number of vacancies for Teachers. The second leading was Public Administration and Defence which is predominantly Government.



2.4 Qualifications Requested

A further analysis of the types of qualifications required for the job vacancies for the quarter indicated that having a bachelor's degree was an advantage. A total of 641 or 37 per cent of the jobs advertised required persons to have a minimum of a bachelor's degree (See Figure 1).

2.5 Job Advertisements by Parish

When analysed by parish, the data showed most of the vacancies were in Kingston and St. Andrew (KSA). Vacancies in KSA represented 48.8 per cent of the total jobs advertised, followed by St. James with 6.2 per cent and St. Catherine 5.4 per cent.

3.0 LMIS/ELE Report

The Labour Market Information System (LMIS) is a mechanism through which information on trends in the labour market are collected, stored, analyzed and disseminated. The LMIS is not only a one stop labour market information source, but also a job search, career development and job placement facility. Job placement is facilitated through the Electronic Labour Exchange depart which provides data on vacancies available to the public. The data provided showed the Top Ten vacancies for January to March 2020 were as follows:

4.0 Work Permits Issued by the MLSS

This section reports on work permits made available to international job seekers/employers that were approved by the MLSS during the period January to March 2020. The MLSS grants work permits and exemptions, based on the requirements of the Foreign Nationals and Commonwealth Citizens (Employment) Act (1964), as well as the CARICOM Community (Free Movement of Skilled Persons) Act (1997). This is to ensure that the Jamaican economy is supplied with the labour and

skills necessary for growth and development, whilst undertaking steps to protect the jobs of Jamaicans. Foreign and Commonwealth Nationals, who wish to engage in employment activities on the island, must obtain a work permit or work permit exemption before entering Jamaica. This is whether the form of employment is voluntary, commercial, business, professional, and charitable, entertainment or sports.

The total number of work permits issued for the period was 1,053. This figure represents both new and renewed applications. Applications with the highest number of approvals were Managers with a total of 420 or 40.0 per cent. Technicians followed with a total of 207 or 19.7 per cent of the total work permits granted; while Trade Related Workers accounted for 5.2 per cent or 55 approvals.

5.0 Report from Private Employment Agencies


Data submitted by PEAs to the MLSS for the period January to March 2020 was used to ascertain the types of positions that were in demand overseas for the period. For the period, vacancies were reflected in the United States and Canada which includes job availability for Hotel (H2B), J1 and Cruise ship workers. The number of vacancies for the period totalled 2,614. Persons working as Housekeepers topped the list with the highest total of 1,020 or 69.4 per cent. Lifeguards followed with a total of 325 vacancies or 22.1 per cent. Of significance were persons in the Other Worker category with a total of 469 vacancies or 18.0 per cent.
