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# BRIEF HISTORY, AIMS AND RESPONSIBILTIES OF THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND SOCIAL SECURITY

The portfolio of the Ministry of Labour and Social Security (MLSS) concerns matters affecting individuals in their capacity as workers, employers, labour force participants, National Insurance Scheme (NIS) pensioners, Persons with Disabilities (PwDs), Senior Citizens and beneficiaries of Public Assistance/Programme of Advancement Through Health and Education (PATH).

The responsibilities of the Labour Division are administered through the Industrial Relations, Manpower Services and Occupational Safety & Health (OSH) Departments. The work of the Social Security Division is carried out through the NIS, Public Assistance programmes, as well as programmes for PwDs and senior citizens.

The Labour Division of the Ministry commenced operations in 1938 as an Employment Bureau and was the first official response to growing unemployment, which was widespread throughout Jamaica at the time. The relationship between employer and employee then, was akin to master and servant. This gave rise to grave economic disparities as many Jamaicans received low wages and lived and worked in substandard conditions. The prevailing labour relations resulted in the need for an agency to monitor the working conditions within the labour market.

The Social Security Division of the Ministry seeks to provide a social safety net through the efficient administration of the contributory NIS and non-contributory Public Assistance Programmes. In response to a need for social programmes which catered to all sections of the population, a planning team was established to develop a social security scheme. Technical assistance was obtained from the International Labour Organization (ILO) to develop proposals for this Scheme. This gave rise to the NIS, which is a compulsory contributory social security scheme which offers financial protection to the worker and his family, against loss of income arising from injury on the job, incapacity, retirement or death of the contributor. The National Insurance (NI) Act was passed in 1965 and became effective April 4, 1966. The Scheme was established under the liabilities of the Sugar Workers' Pension Scheme. The Social Security Division evolved from this as programmes were added to address the needs of vulnerable groups.

# **PORTFOLIO AREAS**

The Ministry executes its mandate through the Executive Direction and Administration Programme and two (2) Divisions, Labour and Social Security as indicated in its moniker. The general administration, planning and overall management of the Ministry of Labour and Social Security (MLSS) is carried out by the Executive Direction and Administration Programme, which is headed by the Permanent Secretary. The areas which are administered by the Executive Direction and Administration are:

- Policy, Planning and Development

# LABOUR DIVISION

The Industrial Relations Department (IR) is the arm of the Government of Jamaica legally authorized to intervene (solicited or unsolicited) in the industrial disputes, particularly those that relate to the national interest.

### Conciliation

This is performed in industrial disputes relating primarily to wage and fringe benefits negotiations, disciplinary matters and union claims for representational rights.

### **Pre-Conciliation**

This is an arm of the Conciliation Section that provides advice and other assistance with the aim of fostering improved relations between management and labour, thereby facilitating a more harmonious industrial relations climate.

### THE INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES TRIBUNAL

The Industrial Disputes Tribunal (IDT) is charged with the responsibility to determine and settle all industrial disputes referred by the Ministry. Where the parties fail to arrive at a settlement at the local level, the matter is then reported to the Ministry for settlement by the Conciliation Unit. If the settlement is not reached at this level, the dispute is referred to the IDT for a decision, except in the case of essential services.

### PAY AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

The Pay and Conditions of Employment Branch (PCEB) is an arm of the Industrial Relations (IR) Department. Its core function is to ensure compliance with the minimum standards set out in the Labour Laws of Jamaica for non-unionised workers.

### The PCEB relies on the following Labour Laws in the execution of their core functions:

- 1. Employment (Termination and Redundancy Payments) Act which includes Redundancy Pay and Notice Pay
- 2. Minimum Wage Act which covers Household, Industrial Security Guard, Trade and Other workers
- 3. Holidays with Pay Act which includes vacation leave and sick leave
- 4. Maternity Leave Act

#### WORK PERMIT

The Work Permit section grants work permits and exemptions, based on the requirements of the Foreign Nationals and Commonwealth Citizens (Employment) Act (1964), and recognizes skilled CARICOM Nationals for free movement under the Caribbean Community (Free Movement of Skilled Persons) Act (1997). This is to ensure that the Jamaican economy is supplied with the labour and skills necessary for growth and development, whilst undertaking steps to protect the jobs of Jamaicans. Foreign and Commonwealth Nationals who wish to engage in employment activities, must obtain a work permit or work permit exemption before entering Jamaica.

## **OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH**

The Occupational Safety and Health Department (OSHD) is responsible for promoting, monitoring and enforcing safe and healthy workplaces under the Jamaican Factories Act of 1943 and its associated Regulations. This Legislation currently gives the Department jurisdiction only to protect workers involved in industrial establishment type activities such as factories, ships, docks and construction.

## The objectives of the OSH act include:

- The prevention of injury and illness caused by conditions of the workplace
- The protection of workers from risk to their safety, health and welfare arising out of, or in connection to activities in their workplace
- The promotion of safe and healthy workplaces by way of collaboration of all stakeholders in the workplace

## The main Services of the Occupational Safety and Health Department are to:

- Register
- Registered Factories
- Investigate industrial accidents
- Approve factory building plans

# SOCIAL SECURITY DNSON

## NATIONAL INSURANCE SCHEME

The National Insurance Scheme (NIS) is a compulsory contributory funded social security scheme covering all employed persons in Jamaica. It is administered under the National Insurance Act and offers some financial protection to the worker and his or her family against loss of income arising from injury on the job, sickness, retirement and/or death of the bread winner.

## The type of benefits are:

- 1. Maternity Allowance which is payable to qualified Domestic Workers.
- 2. **Special Child Benefit** is provided to a child/children whose mother is deceased and there is no father present. This benefit is payable to a guardian if the child/children are under 18.
- 3. **Orphan Benefit** is payable to the guardian of child/children under 18 where both parents are deceased.
- 4. Employment Injury Benefit is payable to an employee who has sustained a job related injury.
- 5. **Employment Injury Disablement Benefit** is given to an employee at the end of the Employment Injury period where the disability(s) has been diagnosed by the Medical Board of the NIS.
- 6. **Employment Injury Death Benefit** is payable upon the death of an employee due to the injury caused relating to the nature of their job.
- 7. **Invalidity Benefit** is to a contributor who has been diagnosed with a medical condition that affects their ability to work for a continuous period of at least 26 weeks.
- 8. **Retirement Pension** is payable during the life of the contributor at the required retirement age.
- 9. **Spouse Allowance** is only payable to a pensioner whose spouse is not in receipt or eligible for a benefit from the NIS.
- 10. Widow's/Widower's Benefit is received by the spouse of a deceased contributor or pensioner.
- **11. Special Anniversary** is a benefit payable to those who were born before January 1, 1908 and were not eligible to contribute to the NIS.
- **12. Funeral Grant** is payable upon the death of a NIS contributor or a NIS pensioner or their spouse or the death of an employee who had sustained an injury relating to their job.
- 13. Grant is awarded to a person who did not meet the requirements to receive a pension only once.
- **14. NI Gold** is a health insurance plan which provides comprehensive medical coverage for all NIS pensioners.

## PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAMMES

The Public Assistance Programme has responsibility for the administration of several non-contributory social assistance programmes, including the Programme of Advancement Through Health and Education (PATH) and the Rehabilitation Grants Programme. These Programmes provide financial assistance (one-off grants) and support to the most vulnerable groups in the society, with the aim of meeting the immediate needs of the individual or the family.

The Rehabilitation Programme offers four (4) types of grants:

- 1. **Rehabilitation Grant**-This Grant provides an opportunity for individuals/families to undertake income generating projects to improve their economic status. It provides assistance to establish small businesses or boost existing ones, in areas such as haberdashery, trading, dressmaking etc.
- 2. **Compassionate Grant**-The Compassionate Assistance Grant is available to persons in need of speedy assistance and who are unable to access assistance under any other Scheme. Assistance is usually provided to meet urgent needs such as prescriptive aids, medication, household items, house repairs and burial expenses.
- 3. **Emergency Relief Grant**-This Grant is available to assist persons who have suffered a disaster, whether man-made or natural, such as an earthquake, hurricane, fire, etc. Assistance is usually provided for personal belongings, basic food items or toiletries.
- 4. Education and Social Intervention Grant-The ESI Grant is available to assist children who cannot attend school or whose regular attendance is affected by their parents' or guardians' inability to provide uniforms, school books and other basic needs.

The Programme of Advancement Through Health and Education (PATH) provides conditional cash transfers to the poorest and most vulnerable populations who are identified through a systematic, transparent and objective Beneficiary Identification System.

The main objectives of PATH are to:

- increase educational attainment and improve health outcomes of the poor
- alleviate poverty by increasing the value of transfer to the poor
- reduce child labour by requiring children to have a minimum attendance in school
- serve as a safety net by preventing families from falling further into poverty in the event of adverse shock

PATH therefore targets poor families and provides benefits for children (0-18 years or up to the age of leaving secondary school), the elderly (persons 60 years and above), persons with disabilities, pregnant and lactating women and poor adults).

## THE EARLY STIMULATION PROGRAMME (ESP)

The Early Stimulation Programme (ESP) is an early intervention programme for young children (0-6 years), with various types of developmental disabilities. Among the disabilities managed by this Programme are Cerebral Palsy and other physical disabilities, sensory impairment, Autism, Down syndrome, developmental delay, secondary to psychosocial deprivation and comorbid behavioural problems, including Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder also known as (ADHD). Some of the services offered include:

- Development Assessment
- Special early childhood education/community based intervention within homes, schools, day care centres and other institutions.
- Parents/staff training and public education on matters regarding disabilities.
- Full time physiotherapy and part time speech therapy for children with speech impairment.
- Counselling and support for families/ caregivers who have difficulties coping with the challenges of their children's disability along with support groups.

## JAMAICA COUNCIL FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

The Jamaica Council for Persons with Disabilities (JCPD) is responsible for the implementation of policies and programmes for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs). The current mandate of the Council is to promote the protection of the rights of PwDs while facilitating their educational, social and economic development. The Council seeks to empower those with disability, by promoting independence through training and development.
